**GSF Report:** The March GSF meeting had about 10 partcipants, and it was a lively fruitful discussion on 3 issues:

- 1.) It was the consensus that the new proposed lit. form would help Lit. Chair to keep AREA and the fellowship advised as how it was going; it was clarified that each H&I and PI was usually paid its \$100 monthly "stipend" by AREA directly to Lit. for lit it supplied to those committees;
- 2.) It was the consensus that AREA seems to "break even" over the year with donations from groups PLUS fund raiser monies; thus GSF is asking AREA to ask all Groups to consider raising the \$1 "suggested" donation amout to \$2 for those that can afford it; 3.) It was hoped that more groups would help CAR (Tony L.) prepare for the conference
- coming up soon.

  4) PI committee is going to look at the past year expenditures and see what they
- actually spend, since PI uses less than \$100. We may be able to come up with a better (lower) budget number than \$100 per month.
- 5) We talked about the Speaker Jam (Chris from Out and About was at the GSF). Possibly Area could help with Speaker Jam. Some comments include "purpose is Unity"; there is "split the pot". "Quarterly is a little more attractive than monthly."
