What is PI in Anchorage?

The Narcotics Anonymous message is "that an addict, any addict, can stop using, lose the desire to use and find a new way to live." We perform public information service to increase the awareness and credibility of the NA program. We share our message openly with the public at large, with prospective members, and with professionals at treatment centers, healthcare facilities and law enforcement agencies. Establishing and maintaining a commitment to these relationships, can help us to further our primary purpose. We want to insure that people who regularly come in contact with addicts in our community will feel comfortable in recommending Narcotics Anonymous. This program works, it is free and it is available to us all.

The spiritual principles of our steps, traditions, and concepts guide us in pursuing our public relations aims and our efforts to enhance NA's public image and reputation. These principles apply to our community and service efforts as well as to the personal behavior and attitude of every individual NA member.

Our Anchorage Area Public Information subcommittee operates the Anchorage Area Helpline and updates and maintains the Anchorage Area schedule of weekly meetings. We provide information to the public by holding presentations for community and professional organizations, distributing flyers and schedules (mail-outs) and airing Public Service Announcements on radio and TV. We participate in local health fairs and the Alaska Annual School of Addictions and Behavioral Health Conference. PI cooperates with H&I and other Area subcommittees to hold learning days and workshops to educate and train our members.

If you would like to participate in the Anchorage Area Public Information subcommittee, contact one of our members or stop by during our business meeting. Anchorage PI meets on the first Sunday after the Area meeting at 6:30 pm at Peggy's Café by the Merrill Field Airport. Men Attend Women's Meeting

Four gentlemen of our Anchorage fellowship attended the *Little Girls Grow Up* NA meeting of Narcotics Anonymous on a Thursday. This meeting is a "closed" "Women Only" NA meeting. The attendance created some drama.

At the Anchorage Area meeting, the GSR for *Little Girls Grow Up* addressed the issue. She allowed that any addict can attend any NA meeting. But it is important to respect this meeting and the regulars that go to the meeting.

Quoting from <u>It Works How and Why</u>, Tradition Four, "In a spirit of cooperation, we try to respect the autonomy of other groups by allowing them the freedom to carry the message in whatever manner seems best to them."

The Little Girls meeting is a safe place for female addicts to let down their hair, many of whom have been abused by men in and out of addiction.

One of the *Little Girl* members voiced, "I for one am perfectly willing to make a man who needs a meeting welcome – our primary purpose is the same as any other group. But *four men* at one time can cause some of our group members to head for cover, clam up, or at least change their share".

Quoting from our text again, "The vitality of NA is enhanced by each group's willingness to find its niche and fill it."

Some meetings we support by attending. Maybe some we support by not attending.

Unity NOT Enmity

Wow! The "Hold on to your Hats" article really touched a nerve when I read it... instead of unity I found enmity.

I've attended NA meetings all over the world and a constant in all of the meetings are the readings. Yes, there are times when I hear the "waaa waaa" of another addict when reading the Who, What, Why, How, 12 Traditions, Just for Today and We Do Recover, BUT, how about the newcomer, who walks into the meetings during their first 30 days and hears literally the essence of the program through these readings, because, unlike the anonymous writer of the article, they probably aren't curled up with their well—read Basic Text because they aren't ready to sit and read NA literature. The best they can do is go to a meeting, sit down and listen. And, what about the not-so-new person who is struggling with a life on life's term issue and reluctantly goes to a meeting, which uses the boring, kindergarten like "old format" readings and hears something again, maybe for the 1001 time, like "through our inability to accept personal ... creating our own problems" and has an 'ah ha' moment and leaves the meeting with a new perspective on their life.

The 4th Tradition especially encourages group autonomy and varied format. NA groups use the readings because they are effective in reaching the newcomer and carrying the message. We are NA and if a member doesn't like something about a group, they are welcome to start a new group, or attend their home group business meeting and suggest changing the current meeting format. Hoping Anonymous finds a meeting that suits their needs.
